ELIGIBILITY:

- **Applicant must be a full time resident of the Four Valleys area (Bird Creek, Indian, Girdwood, Portage).**
- Applicant must be a graduating senior at an accredited institution. This includes Anchorage School District high schools, as well as State of Alaska/Municipality of Anchorage charter and home schools.
- Applicant must demonstrate prior involvement in community service activities, being a peer leader, and a positive influence in the community.
- Applicant will be enrolled full-time in a post-high school institution within six (6) months of graduation.
- Applicant must be a United States citizen.

APPLICATION: Applicants must submit a scholarship folder containing:

- Biographical sketch including personal history, special interests, description of jobs held and community service (450-500 words).
- Three (3) letters of recommendation written and signed. Acceptable sources include classroom teacher, guidance counselor, and other adults.
- Statement of purpose including ambitions and educational plans, (250-300 words).
- Official transcript of classes.

The ideal candidate has a positive influence on the local community through volunteerism or other projects and is involved with extracurricular activities.

SELECTION COMMITTEE: The committee will be composed of three to four (3-4) members, from the FVCS Board, the Lions Club and/or one (1) other interested community adult (without conflict of interest). One (1) member will serve as Chairperson.

BASIS FOR FINAL SELECTION:

Community Service	50 points
Leadership	20 points
Finalist Interview	20 points
Evidence of Personal Growth	10 points

The scholarship committee will call the top five candidates for individual interviews. The scholarship committee may retain the selected entries.

AWARD NOTIFICATION AND PAYMENT: Decision will be rendered by April 15, 2015. All applicants will be notified of award or non-award by telephone call with a letter follow-up. With your application, you agree that FVCS and Lions Club will be allowed to photograph the winner and publish same in *The Turnagain Times*. Upon verification of full time enrollment status of the applicant by the institution, the check will be mailed to the Financial Aid Office of the higher education institution **or** will be made jointly payable to the applicant and the institution.
